INTERLOCUTORY ORDER

Upon the additional findings of fact, numbered 18 to 35, inclusive, which are this day filed herein and made a part of this order, the Commission concludes as a matter of law that the Nooksack Tribe of Indians is entitled to an award in the sum of \$52,383.50 as compensation for the 80,590 acres of land taken by the defendant without payment of any compensation therefor.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED, That the claimant Nooksack Tribe have and recover of and from the defendant the sum of \$52,383.50, less such offsets, if any, that may be allowable under the Indian Claims Commission Act.
