INTERLOCUTORY ORDER

In keeping with the opinion and upon the supplementary findings of fact this day filed in the above entitled action, which are hereby made a part of this order the Commission concludes as a matter of law:

That the Omaha Tribe of Nebraska, Plaintiff, is entitled to recover the sum of \$2,760,833.86 less offsets and credits, if any, which the defendant may be entitled to, and as required by Section 12 of the General Rules of Procedure of this Commission.

It is further ordered that the defendant shall amend its answer by setting forth the amount of offsets, counterclaims, or other demands against the plaintiff as authorized by the Indian Claims Commission Act and within the time required by said Section 12.
