INTERLOCUTORY ORDER

Upon the findings of fact this day filed herein and which are made a part of this order, the Commission concludes as a matter of law:

1. That the petitioner has the right to maintain this cause of action as the successor in interest to the Hualapai Tribe of Indians as it existed on January 4, 1883.
2. That the petitioner has proven Indian title in the Hualapai Tribe to the area of land set forth in Finding of Fact No. 17.
3. That the United States extinguished without the payment of compensation said Indian title to the lands exclusively used and occupied by the Hualapai Indians outside of the Hualapai Reservation on January 4, 1883, on which date the United States set aside by executive order, and the Hualapai Tribe accepted, said reservation.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the case proceed to the determination of the acreage of the tract described in Finding of Fact No. 17, outside the reservation, and the value of said lands on January 4, 1883.
