FINAL JUDGMENT

Upon joint motion by the attorneys for the parties for entry of final judgment in the above numbered docket pursuant to a stipulation of compromise settlement filed herein on the 13th day of March, 1964, which stipulation is hereby incorporated by reference into and made a part of this judgment; and evidence both oral and written in support of said motion having been received and considered at a hearing on said matter on the 13th day of March, 1964, and findings of fact and an opinion on matters of settlement having been entered in this cause; and it further appearing that said compromise settlement was held to be fair and just; and it appearing that there is no just reason for delay in entering final judgment, in accordance with said stipulation, in favor of the Otoe and Missouri Tribe on the claims asserted herein;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED AND ADJUDGED:

1. That the Stipulation for Entry of Final Judgment entered into by the parties, a copy of which was received in evidence in the case and marked Otoe and Missouri Exhibit "A", is hereby approved and adopted by the Commission and hereby by reference made a part hereof; and

2. The joint motion by the parties be, and hereby is granted; and that the plaintiff does have and recover from the defendant the sum of \$1,750,000, subject to the terms and provisions set forth in said Stipulation for Entry of Final Judgment.
