ORDER ALLOWING ATTORNEYS' REIMBURSABLE EXPENSES

Upon consideration of the two applications for reimbursement of expenses, one filed November 10, 1963, by the firm of attorneys for petitioners in Docket No. 67, and one filed by the attorney for petitioners in Docket No. 124, on February 24, 1964, and the objections thereto filed by the defendant, and after hearings before the Commission held on October 28 and 29, 1964, at which all interested parties were represented by counsel,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that from the award made the petitioners in Docket Nos. 67 and 124, consolidated, there shall be paid the sum of \$40,738.63 to the following named attorneys:

(1) To the law firm of Sonnenschein, Levinson, Carlin, Nath and Rosenthal, \$40,648.32, which sum is in full payment for reimbursable expenses incurred by said firm in the prosecution of the claim in Docket No. 67.

(2) To Walter H. Maloney, \$90.31, which sum is in full payment for reimbursable expenses incurred by him in the prosecution of the claim in Docket No. 124.
