FINAL JUDGMENT WITH RESPECT TO DOCKETS 256, 124-D AND 124-E

Findings of Fact and an Interlocutory Order having been made and entered herein on the 18th day of December, 1964, which are hereby made a part hereof and the defendant having waived its claim for offsets in these consolidated dockets, but reserving its right to assert the same in any other docket involving the same petitioners, the Commission concludes as a matter of law:

That under the treaties of October 23, 1834, and November 6, 1838, the Miami Tribe of Oklahoma, petitioner in Docket No. 256, and the Miami Indians of Indiana, petitioner in Docket Nos. 124-D and 124-E, jointly as representatives of the Miami Tribe, are entitled to recover of and from the defendant \$1,329,235 less credits of \$556,103.75 or an award of \$773,131.25.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that petitioners in Docket Nos. 256, 124-D and 124-E do have and recover from the defendant the sum of \$773,131.25.
