ORDER ALLOWING ATTORNEY FEES

Upon consideration of the petition for the allowance of attorneys' fees filed herein on June 16, 1965, by the attorney of record for the Peoria Tribe of Indians of Oklahoma on behalf of the law firm of Brown, Dashow, and Langeluttig, and defendant having voiced no objections to the application for the allowance of said fees in its response of August 5, 1965, the Commission finds:

1. That the attorneys' services were rendered under a contract originally entered into between the Peoria Tribe of Indians of Oklahoma and the law firm of Brown, Dashow, and Ziedman, now Brown, Dashow, and Langeluttig; that said contract (I-1-ind. No. 42129) was approved for a period of ten years beginning December 24, 1948; that said contract was subsequently extended for a period of 5 years from December 24, 1958, and thereafter amended and extended for a period of 10 years beginning December 24, 1963, and

2. That said contract, as amended and extended, fixes the compensation of the attorneys at,

"\*\*\* ten per centum (10%) of any and all sums recovered or procured through efforts, in whole or in part for the said Indians, whether by award of the Indian Claims Commission, suit, action of any department of the Government, or the Congress of the United States, \*\*\*"

3. That the Indian Claims Commission on July 29, 1963, entered a final award of \$876,477.30 in favor of the Peoria Tribe of Indians of Oklahoma, and, on appeal, said award was affirmed by the Court of Claims and is now final in all respects.

4. That pursuant to the terms of their contract the petitioning attorneys have rendered valuable legal services herein to the Peoria Tribe of Indians of Oklahoma and they are therefore entitled to the attorneys' fees as requested.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, that as compensation for all legal services rendered herein, the law firm of Dashow, Brown and Langeluttig shall be paid the sum of \$87,647.73 out of the judgment funds, if and when they are deposited in the United States Treasury to the credit of the Peoria Tribe of Indians of Oklahoma.
