ORDER

Upon the Findings of Fact and Opinion this day entered herein which are hereby made a part of this order, the Commission has concluded as a matter of law that:


1. The subject tract that was ceded by the Osage Nation under the Treaty of November 10, 1808 contained 12,113,000 acres;
2. As of April 28, 1810, the effective date of the Treaty of 1808, the subject tract had a fair market value of \$7,000,000;
3. Under the provisions of the Treaty of 1808, the United States paid the Osage Nation \$56,833.79 for the subject tract;
4. The payment of \$56,833.79 for lands worth \$7,000,000 is payment of an unconscionable consideration under the Indian Claims Commission Act (60 Stat. 1050), and the defendant is liable to the plaintiff for additional compensation.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the Osage Nation or Tribe of Indians, plaintiff herein, shall have and recover of and from the defendant the sum of \$6,943,166.21, less any allowable offsets.


IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this case shall now proceed for determination of allowable offsets and all other matters bearing on defendant's


liability to plaintiff herein.


