FINAL ORDER


Upon the findings of fact numbered 1 through 48 heretofore entered in the case at bar, the opinion issued concurrently with the said findings of fact, the additional findings of fact and opinion this date issued in the case at bar, all of which are hereby incorporated in this final order, this Commission concludes as a matter of law that:

1. The defendant is not entitled to credit for the consideration of \$1,242,796.18 paid the plaintiffs because the defendant used and exhausted such credit in defending a suit in the Court of Claims in the early 1930's; and


2. This Commission being unable in good conscience to sanction the allowance of any offset of any gratuities claimed by the defendant;


IT IS ORDERED that the plaintiffs recover a net judgment in the amount of \$3,108,506.40.
