AMENDED INTERLOCUTORY ORDER

Upon findings of fact this day filed herein and which are hereby made part of this order, the Commission concludes as a matter of law:

1. That the plaintiff herein, the Papago Tribe of Arizona, is entitled to prosecute this action.
2. That the plaintiff has satisfactorily established that the Papago Tribe of Arizona held original Indian title to that land in the present State of Arizona described in Finding No. 25. For valuation purposes the following areas are excluded:
 - a. The San Xavier del Bac Indian Reservation and the Papago Indian Reservation; and
 - b. The confirmed Spanish and Mexican land grants within the aforesaid area.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED and adjudged that the case proceed for the purpose of determining the date or dates of taking of the above-described tract, all other issues being reserved for future proceedings, and it is further

ORDERED that paragraph 2 of the interlocutory order entered herein on September 10, 1968 be, and the same is hereby, amended as indicated by paragraph 2 of this order.
