ORDER AMENDING FINDINGS OF FACT ENTERED MARCH 15, 1972

UPON CONSIDERATION of defendant's motion for rehearing filed April 11, 1972, and plaintiffs' response thereto and for the reasons set forth in the opinion this day filed herein, the Commission concludes that the motion should be granted, without necessity of further hearing.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Finding of Fact No. 15 entered on March 15, 1972, be stricken and there be set forth in lieu thereof the following:

15. Evidence of sales in or near the ceded reservations during the approximate time of the cession includes the reports of sales of land selected by the State of Ohio to fund the canal projects. The land in adjacent sections, in the vicinity of the reservations at Wolf Rapids and Roche de Boeuf, were sold at prices varying from \$3.00 to \$6.00 per acre. The Governor's Report No. 1 to the 35th General Assembly of Ohio in 1836, discloses that along the proposed canal routes in Bucyrus Land District 76,742.74 acres were selected; that this selection included 8,884.45 acres from the Indian Reserve at Roche de Boeuf; and that of the entire selection 17,418 acres sold at public sale in Perrysburg, Ohio November 14, 1834, for an average of \$8.60 per acre. In Lima Land District, which includes lands proximate to Royce 167 and 168, Ohio public lands sales held October 24, 1834, at Defiance, Ohio, brought an average price of \$4.25 per acre.


IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the findings of fact and opinion entered herein, March 15, 1972, remain the same in all other respects, and as such affirmed.


IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the case now proceed to the remaining stages of litigation.
