ORDER DISMISSING CLAIM WITH PREJUDICE


UPON CONSIDERATION of the motion to dismiss filed by the plaintiff on September 27, 1972, on the ground that the 21,008.66 acres of land within the area of Tract D, and formerly a part of the Gifford Pincheot National Forest, has been returned to the plaintiff tribe by Executive Order of May 20, 1972, and the defendant not objecting thereto, and


IT APPEARING to the Commission that under the terms of the stipulation of settlement in Docket Nos. 47, 147, 160, and 164 filed by the parties on October 11, 1968, it was specifically agreed that the aforementioned portion of the Tract D claim in Docket No. 47 be embodied in a separate petition to be filed before the Indian Claims Commission and designated Docket No. 47-B to enable the Yakima Tribe to seek restoration of these lands to the Yakima Reservation, and that if said land was restored to the Yakima Tribe through administrative or other action of the United States, that Docket No. 47-B would be dismissed with prejudice by this Commission, and


IT FURTHER APPEARING that by Executive Order of May 20, 1972, said land was returned to the Yakima Tribe and that said Tribe by resolution dated September 25, 1972, has further agreed that Docket No. 47-B be dismissed, it is therefore


ORDERED that Docket No. 47-B be, and the same is hereby, dismissed with prejudice.


